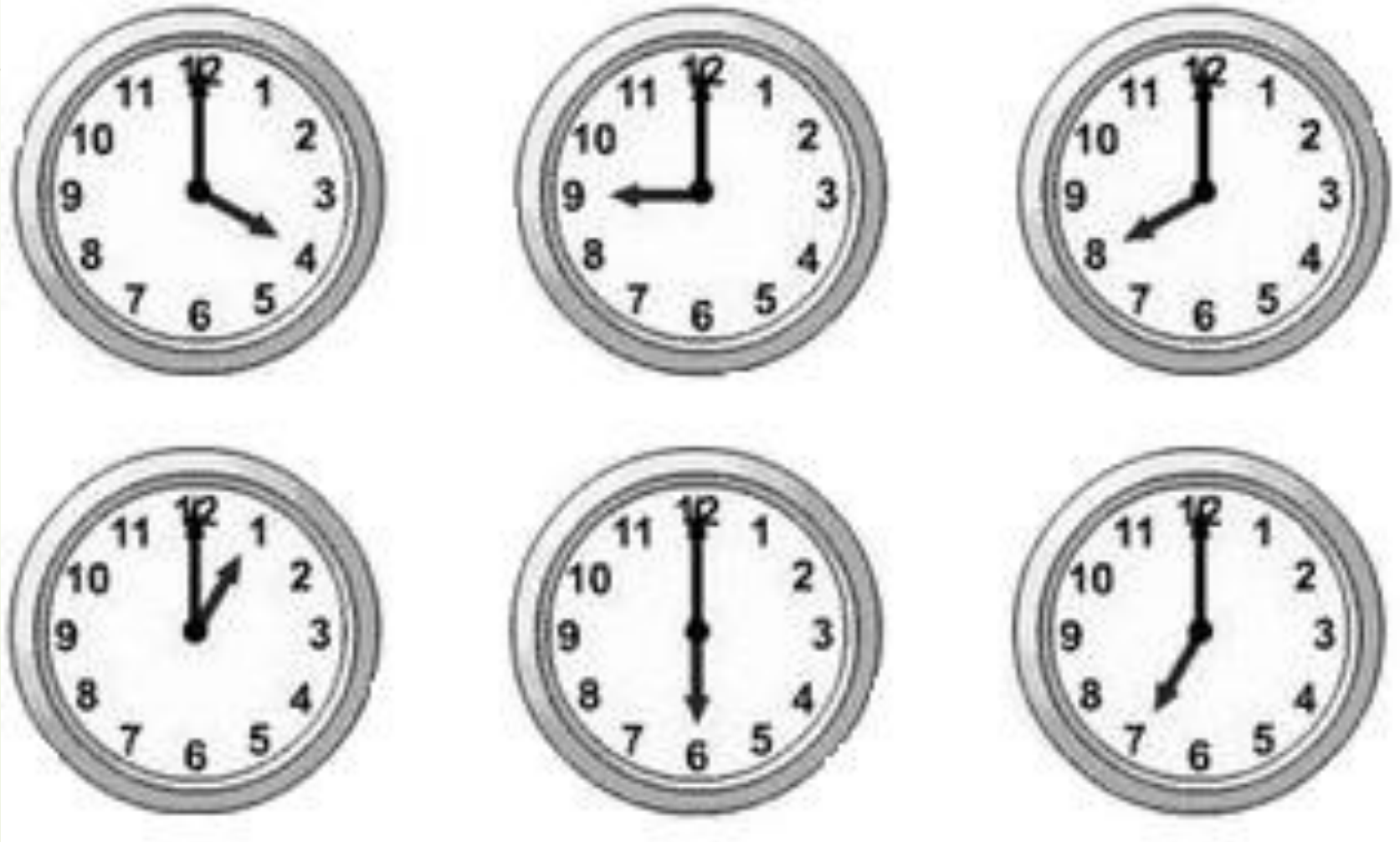

What time is it? It's o'clock.

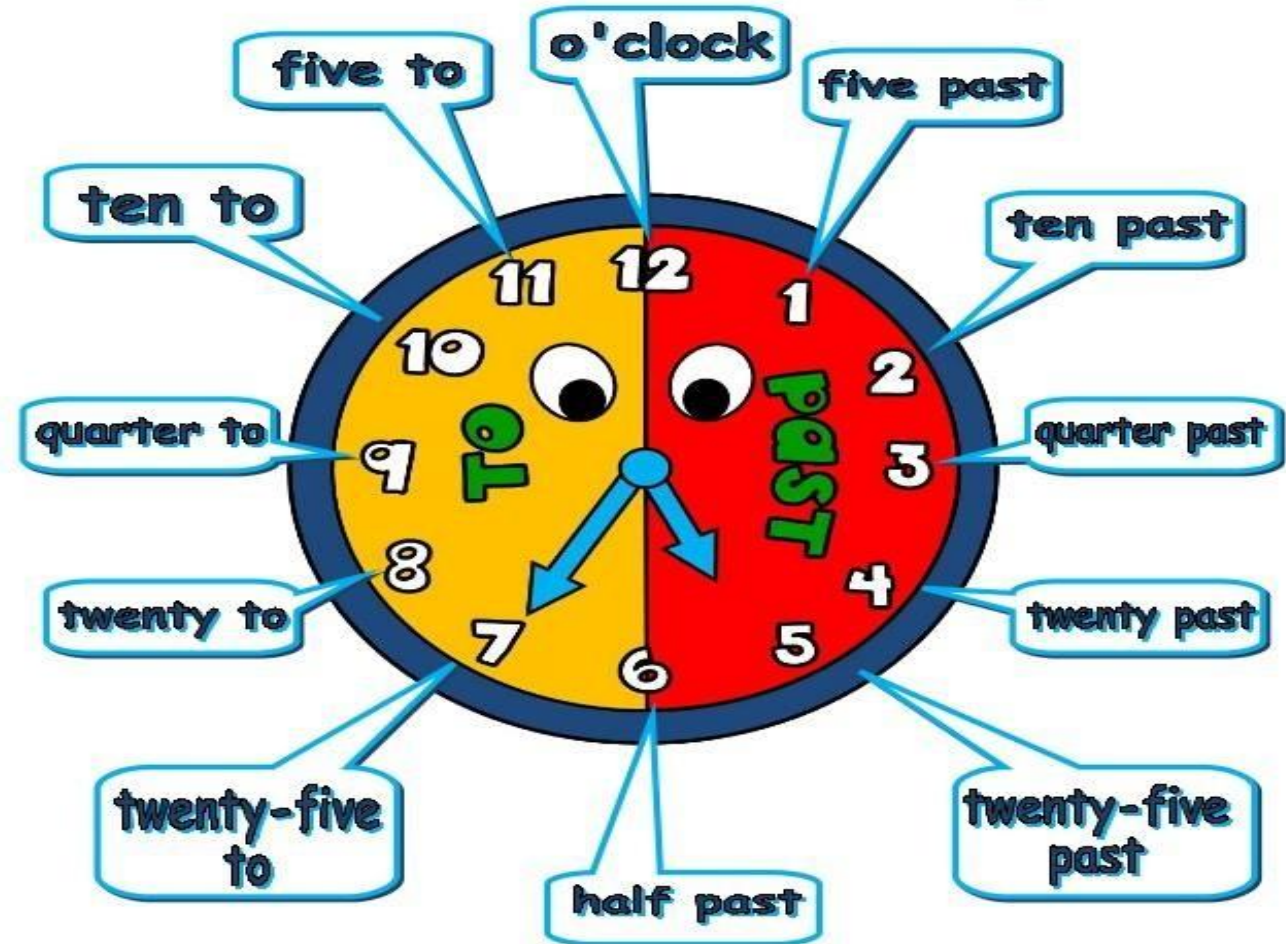


TELLING THE TIME: Informal way

- ❖ 1:00 = (It's) one (o'clock).
- ❖ 1:05 = It's one oh five.
- ❖ 1:10 = It's one ten.
- ❖ 1:15 = It's one fifteen.
- ❖ 1:20 = It's one twenty.
- ❖ 1:25 = It's one twenty-five.
- ❖ 1:30
- ❖ 1:35
- ❖ 1:40
- ❖ 1:50
- ❖ 1:55
- ❖ 2:00

Formal Way

What's the time?



a.m. → Latin - ante meridiem = **before noon**

p.m. → Latin - post meridiem = **after noon**



TELLING THE TIME: Expressions

Como dizer meio dia e meia noite em inglês...

Meio dia:

- ❖ **12 pm** = midday = noon = 12 o'clock pm

Meia noite:

- ❖ **12 am** = midnight = 12 o'clock am



TELLING THE TIME: Symbols

Como dizer sete da manhã e sete da noite em inglês?

❖ **Sete da manhã:**

7 am = 7 in the morning = seven in the morning
= 7 o'clock am

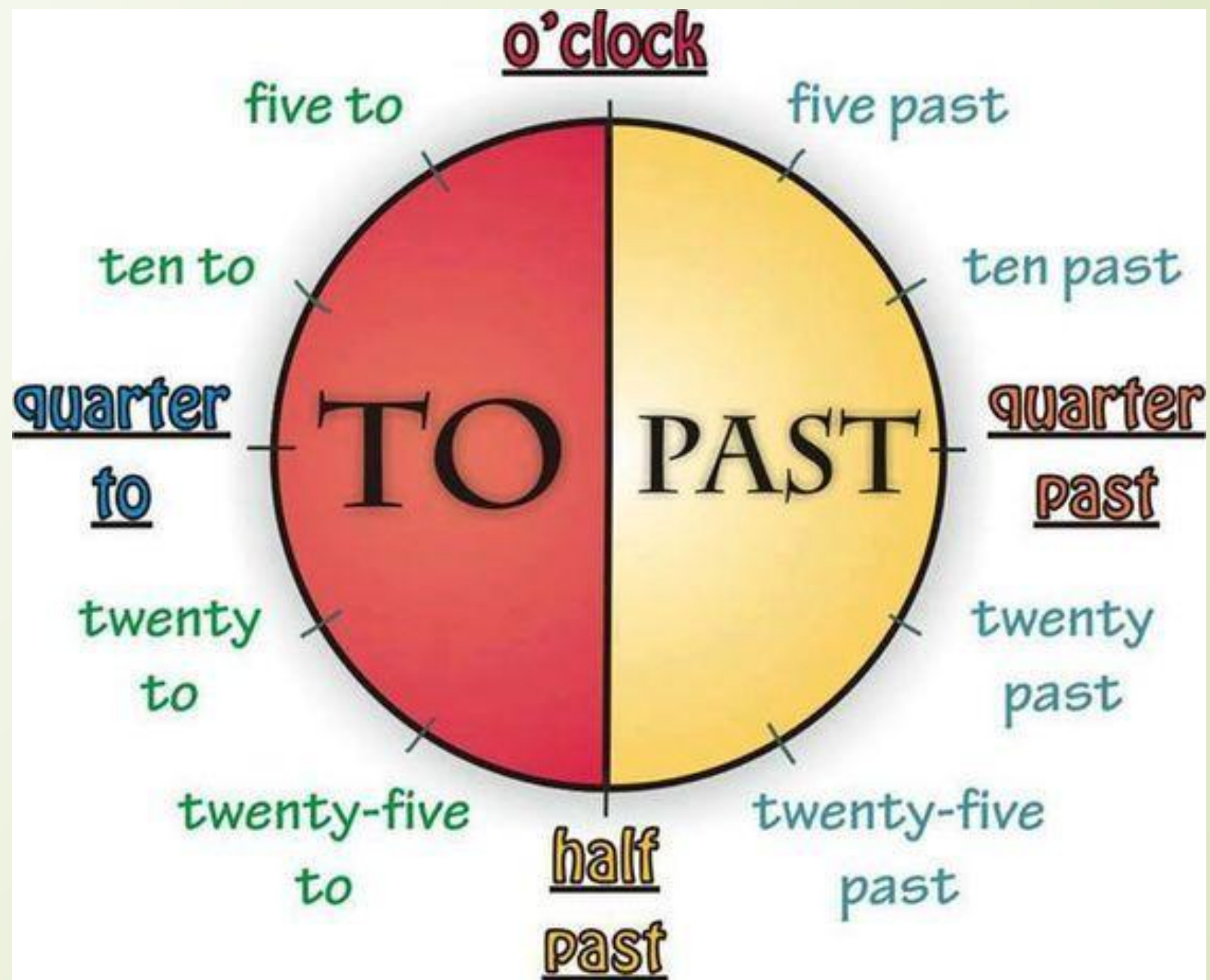
❖ **Sete da noite:**

7 pm = 7 in the evening = seven in the evening =
7 o'clock pm

TELLING THE TIME: Expressions

- ❖ Ponteiro dos minutos no 3 = 15 minutos passado das...
fifteen minutes past | | **a quarter past**
- ❖ Ponteiro dos minutos no 9 = 15 minutos passado das...
fifteen minutes to | | **a quarter to**
- ❖ Ponteiro dos minutos no 6 = 30 minutos passado das...
thirty minutes past | | **half past**

At + Time

=

(às 2h)

Telling the time



2:00 - It's two **o'clock**.

2:05 - It's five **past** two.

2:10 - It's ten **past** two.

2:15 - It's quarter **past** two.

2:20 - It's twenty **past** two.

2:25 - It's twenty-five **past** two.

2:30 - It's half **past** two.

2:35 - It's twenty-five **to** three.

2:40 - It's twenty **to** three.

2:45 - It's quarter **to** three.

2:50 - It's ten **to** three.

2:55 - It's five **to** three.

We use AT + TIME when giving the time of a specific event.

- The class starts at nine o'clock.
- The flight leaves at ten to three.

We use IT IS or IT'S to answer a question that asks for the time right now.

- What time is it? - It is half past four.
What's the time? - It's twenty to five.


